We have "Improved efficiency, effectiveness and demonstrated cost effective solutions" as follows: In addition to Adobe Acrobat for document PDF conversion, <u>www.penticton.ca</u> has recently begun utilizing the Macromedia products Contribute and FlashPaper. Contribute allows various department staff to easily maintain and update their own content.

Our new initiatives provide "...Applicability and transferability to other UBCM members" because they are primarily founded on available retail hardware/software.

We have created "*Improved public accountability and awareness* of *local government*" by providing an easy-to-use site navigation menu, live and recorded video of Council events, full posting of all public notices, bylaws, minutes, etc. and interactive features such as the Water Smart House (also promoted and advertised in all other forms of local media).

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Staff are easily able to upload and maintain all Public Notices, Bylaws, Meeting Minutes etc.

The City of Penticton website has been a strong feature of our local government for several years. It is maintained by City Webmaster Dave Wilson and continues to grow with new features offered every year. It is still the only known municipal site to change colors and themes with the holidays and seasons!

# Web Development Highlights

## 1. Video-Streaming Studio and Archive

In a major multimedia effort, we have overhauled our video usage to provide video services unparalleled by any other municipality in Western Canada. After our local cable TV provider ceased live coverage of Penticton Council Meetings, we made the decision to provide a live video stream via the web. The first step in this process was acquiring a new Windows Media Server which allowed us to stream both live video events and on-demand recorded video archives.

Our second step was the development and installation of a powerful production studio from our very own Council Chambers. This studio includes eight high-resolution color static cameras, two high-resolution color pan/tilt/zoom cameras, a video capturing/encoding computer and large audio/video switching rack.



The Council Chambers switching rack holds all A/V filtering and switching equipment.

Council Chambers - now a full video production studio. The cameras are unobtrusive but allow excellent images and close-ups.

Approximately **30 different camera shots** are available – all controlled from an easy-to-use touch panel at the video encoding station.

In addition to our studio facilities inside Council Chambers, we have also created a mobile video unit comprised of a laptop configured for video encoding and an external video capture device. A local professional cameraman with camera/tripod is contracted to provide mobile video images. This allows us to live stream events from any location in the city.

<u>www.penticton.ca</u> now broadcasts all Public Council events live onto the net, as well as recording them for later access from our comprehensive online video review archive. Additional future uses for the Council Studio will include real-time video conferencing, local and remote staff training, online support for the Emergency Operations Centre (if/when required) and more.


Steps Out Program - interactive step update map.



# 5. Active Webmail featuring Outlook Web Access

Full Webmail access now allows City staff to review and use their city email, calendars, notes and contact lists from any internet computer in the world! It has already proven to be a huge boon to City managers and others who must communicate and conduct business after hours or outside the office. Users are even able to review their voicemail messages over the internet due to the **fully email-integrated VoIP phone system** that the City of Penticton now operates.



Penticton Webmail - Outlook Web Access provides staff with full use of their city email, schedule, etc.




6. Content Management with Macromedia Contribute and Document Conversion via Macromedia FlashPaper

The use of Macromedia Contribute allows City Staff in each department to maintain and update their own web content. They are able to modify existing pages, upload their own files and photos, and display virtually all documents via linked PDF or FlashPaper.

www.penticton.ca has always made extensive use of Adobe Acrobat .pdf files for many of the documents we publish. However, we have now expanded our document conversions to use embedded FlashPaper files on pages featuring agendas, maps, PowerPoint presentations, etc. FlashPaper is very affordable with a fast and easy conversion process. Once converted, the .swf files simply drag-and-drop onto a webpage. They appear with their own frames and tool bars allowing word search, zoom in/zoom out, print, etc. All UBCM members should seriously review and consider the use of this powerful new tool on their web site.
